Kawagodaira

In this hidden spot in Amagi, you will find traces of the Kawagodaira Volcano crater, masses of ejected volcanic rock, and above those, giant Japanese beech trees, thousands of stewartia monadelphapplings, Fuji cherry trees, ferns, and more.

4 Kawagodaira Course

This is a secluded part of Amagi. There are three routes at the approach: the route from the Haccho Pond side of the Amagi Traverse Route, the route from the Amagi-Kogen Golf Course side, and the route from the Nakaizu Ikadabashinden side. Two recommended routes are introduced here.

[Course from Haccho Pond to Nishi-Kawagodaira]

(10.6km / about 3h45min., not including distance and time to Haccho Pond)

* Use the Haccho Pond Route, Ascending Gyoko Path, Descending Gyoko Path, Sushochi Path, etc. for the round trip to and from Haccho Pond.

1 Amagi Traverse Route Course

(17.5km / about 7h35min.)

This course starts from Amagi Pass, passes Haccho Pond, and runs through the Amagi mountain ridge, which is covered by a primeval forest of Japanese beech, stewartia monadelphapplings, and maple.

The animals of Amagi

A number of animals live amid the temperate climate and rich nature of Amagi. As many as 64 species of wild birds have been confirmed to reside year-round in the Haccho Pond area, including the Siberian blue robin, blue-and-white flycatcher, Japanese bush warbler, great spotted woodpecker, Japanese green woodpecker, varied tit, Japanese tit, Japanese robin, long-tailed tit, and lesser cuckoo. The forest green tree frog also comes to lay its eggs in Haccho Pond and Shiranuta Pond. This frog and other biota surrounding Shiranuta Pond have been designated as, and are protected as, natural monuments of Shizuoka Prefecture.

2 Enjoy the unique tastes of Amagi

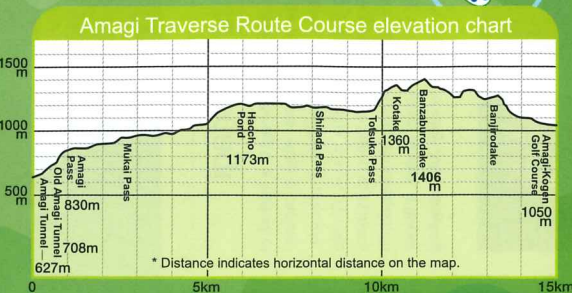
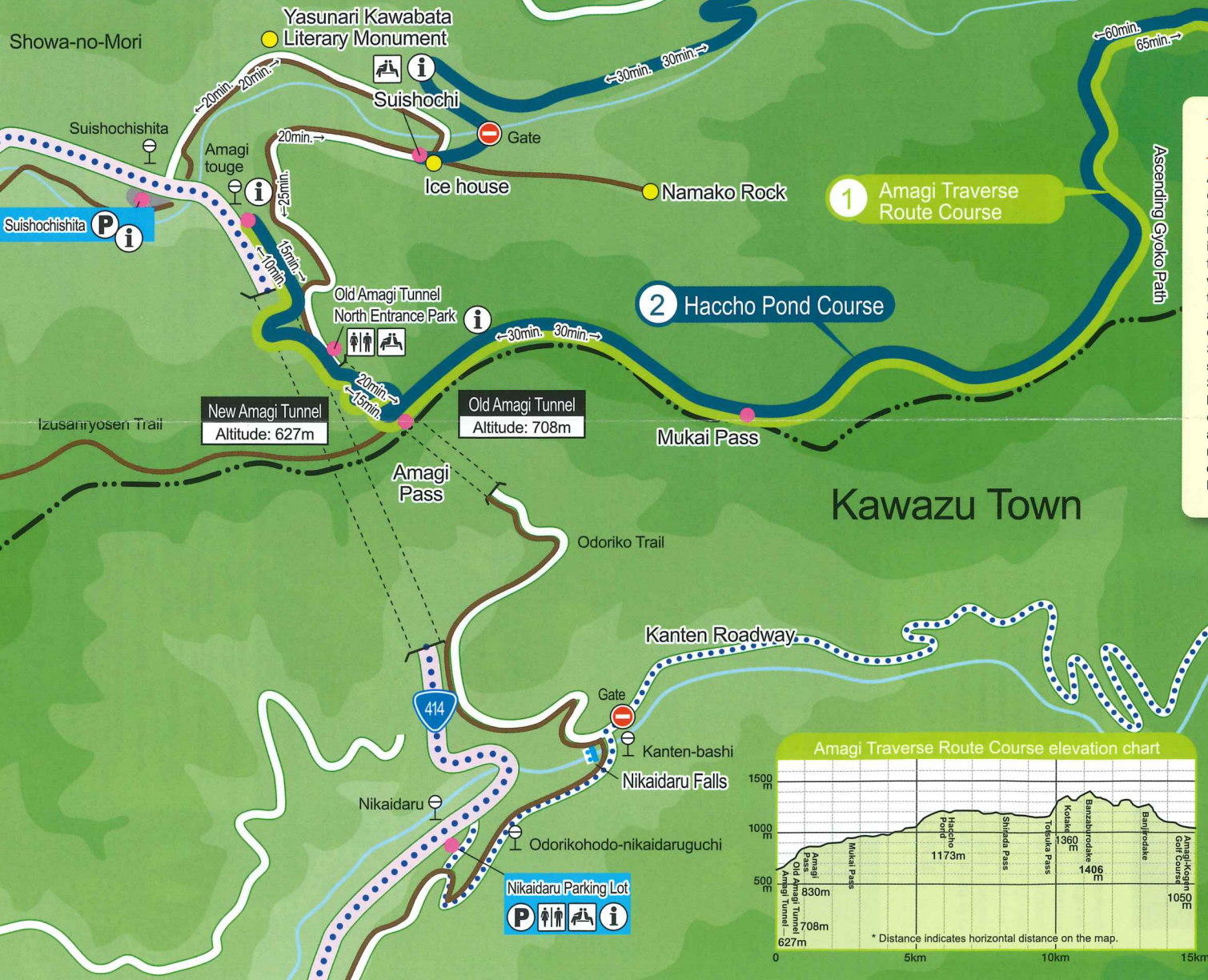
